
This month's edition (July) centers on the 50th anniversary of Pope Paul VI's insightful encyclical, Humanae Vitae. Initially viewed by many as regressive and unnecessary. Yet, as stated in the editorial, "it has become increasingly clear that the sexual revolution, despite its promise of "free love" brought neither authentic freedom nor authentic love, but the reverse. Indeed, the expansion of the culture of death and the breakdown of the family" have demonstrated the prophetic nature of the pope's message.

Supreme Knight Anderson eloquently writes that Catholics of the responsibility by all to "respect the dignity of every human being and the sanctity of every human life." As Knights, he reminds us, must more clearly live in a way that witnesses "to holiness, evangelization, charity and social justice."

A huge assistance to live so comes from Supreme Chaplain, Archbishop William E. Lori. "I challenge you," he writes, "to 'come away' to a quiet place by praying at least five minutes a day, first thing in the morning before you check your electronic devices or the TV."

Continue reading through the magazine as ordinary people share extraordinary lives with us including a daring young man's determination to say "Yes to Chastity."

CANONIZATION OF POPE PAUL VI



Beatified by Pope Francis on October 19, 2004, the late pontiff (1963-1978) will be canonized on October 14, the day after the Fatima "Miracle of the Sun" and the day of the ROSARY RALLY at St. Paul's.

Along with Pope Paul VI, other heroes of the Church will also be canonized:

- Oscar Arnulfo Romero Galdámez, archbishop of San Salvador, martyr
- Francesco Spinelli, diocesan priest, founder of the Institute of the Sisters Adorers of the Most Holy Sacrament
- Vincenzo Romano, diocesan priest
- Maria Katharina Kasper, virgin, founder of the Institute of the Poor Handmaids of Jesus Christ
- Nazaria Ignacia de Santa Teresa de Jesús (née: Nazaria Ignacia March Mesa), founder of the Congregation of the Missionary Crusaders of the Church
