

Pastor's Desk

Peace and all God's blessings.

This seventh Sunday of Easter, we are going to celebrate the Solemnity of the Lord's Ascension. If someone asks us a question: What is your current religion? We would answer the question right away: I am a baptized Catholic. Because we have been Christians for a long time—most of us, for all our lives.

I presume that you and I would say that Jesus has quite an influence on our lives.

Would we say that that influence comes from what Jesus had to say and what He did? That is, from the past? Would we say it is more than that? Would we say that we relate to him, not simply as a significant figure from the past but as someone now?

We pray to him, we communicate to him, as someone real now. Perhaps, we would even say that Jesus also communicates with us.

There have been other significant religious figures in the past: The Buddha, and the prophet Mohammad... Do you know of people who talk to them as real people—now? Do they say that the Buddha, Mohammad, communicates with them? Our claim seems to be unique.

What makes us so sure? Is it simply because others have told us? Or would we say: No, It is more than that...? Would we say: we know it—from our own experience? We know it. We know it in our bones. It is not vision. It is not mysterious words we hear inside our head—but, at some deeper level, we know it.

In the celebration of the Lord's Ascension, we rejoice greatly for the assurance that future glory is realized in Jesus Christ and offered to the human race. This gift encourages us to desire deeply and always the glory of heaven. We wish to go to heaven where Christ has gone. The apostles are asked by the angels, "Why are you gazing in astonishment at the sky? Just as you have seen Him ascend into heaven, so in like manner, shall He return" (Act1:11).

According to Pope Benedict XVI, he explained: "There is an even deeper meaning that is not immediately perceptible. In the passage from the Acts of the Apostles it is said first that Jesus was "lifted up" (v. 9) and then it says, "taken up" (v. 11). The event is not described as a journey to on high but rather as an action of the power of God who introduces Jesus into the space of closeness to the Divine. The presence of the cloud that "took him out of their sight" (v. 9), recalls a very ancient image of Old Testament theology and integrates the account of the

Ascension into the history of God with Israel, from the cloud of Sinai and above the tent of the Covenant in the desert, to the luminous cloud on the mountain of the Transfiguration".

Jesus returned to where he came from and united with God the Father. A journey to on high with the action of the power of God give us a sure and certain hope that God came and prepared for us heaven places—spiritual realms.

2000 years ago, Jesus left the earth and returned to the heavenly Father so easy. He did not wear a spacesuit, a space helmet and flew with a space shuttle. He entered the light of life by the power of God which was a mystery of ascension of the Lord. There is nothing impossible for God.

In the meantime, we are asked to put our hands to work and our hearts to God, doing the will of God, in preparation for the return of our Savior at our death and at Christ's second coming in glory.

We are baptized Catholics, we shall not to forget to celebrate this May in honoring our Blessed Virgin Mary, who is the Mother of God and Mother of the Church.

According to Pope Francis, he said: "She is that woman who rejoiced in the presence of God, who treasured everything in her heart, and who let herself be pierced by the sword. Mary is the saint among the saints, blessed above all others. She teaches us the way of holiness and she walks ever at our side. She does not let us remain fallen and at times she takes us into her arms without judging us."—Pope Francis, Gaudete et Exsultate, no. 176

May is a month for earthly children to celebrate for moms, grandmothers, stepmoms, mothers-to-be. It is also important to realize that Mother's Day can be difficult or painful for women who struggle with infertility, the loss of a child or children, or who are estranged from their own mothers. Show our love to Mother Mary, and to our earthly mothers by real actions with our sincere hearts.

Have a blessed celebration of the Solemnity of the Accession of the Lord!

Mother of God.


