Knights in Action present just the tip of the compassion iceberg reporting the news from various Councils. Each story provides inspiration to us as we continue to grow and serve.



## Saints of the Month

June celebrates the feast days of Peter and Paul and the Apostle Barnabas. A few of the other feast days are:

June 1: St. Justin never ended his quest for religious truth even when he converted to Christianity after years of studying various pagan philosophies. As a young man, he found that the Christian religion answered the great questions about life better than the philosophers.

He became the first Christian philosopher and combined the Christian religion with the best elements in Greek philosophy. As an apologist, he defended the Christian religion against the attacks and misunderstandings of the pagans. For his staunch adherence to the Christian religion, Justin was beheaded in Rome in 165.

June 6: St. Norbert was born in the Rhineland (Germany) about the year 1080. His early life was devoted to the world and its pleasures. To ensure his success at court, he had no qualms about accepting holy orders as a canon and whatever financial gains came with that position.

One day, caught in a violent storm, a sudden flash of lightning caused his horse to buck, throwing Norbert to the ground knocking him unconscious. When he awoke, his first words were, "Lord, what do you want me to do?" - the same words Saul (Paul) spoke on the road to Damascus. In response, Norbert heard in his heart, "Turn from evil and do good. Seek peace and pursue it." He now embraced the instruction for the priesthood and was ordained in 1115. Years of itinerate preaching led to the founding of a religious Order known as the Praemonstratensians or (thankfully!) the Norbertines. The Order provides the first evidence of lay affiliation with a religious order. Reluctantly, Norbert became archbishop of Magdeburg in central Germany, a territory half pagan and half Christian. In this position he zealously and courageously continued his work for the Church until his death on June 6, 1134.

## Rest In Peace



The Knights of Columbus mourns the death of a great friend, Cardinal Francis E. George, archbishop emeritus of Chicago, who passed away April 17 after a prolonged and heroic bout with cancer. He was 78 years old and served as archbishop of Chicago for more than 17 years until his retirement in September 2014. A member of the Oblates of Mary Immaculate, he also served as archbishop of

Portland in Oregon and bishop of Yakima, Wash.

A Knight of Columbus since 1991, he served as the Order's state chaplain for the state of Washington, in addition to serving as host ordinary for the Supreme Convention in Chicago in 2005. The cardinal also presided over the Knights' Eucharistic Congress following that convention, and was a keynote speaker at Supreme Conventions in 2002 and 2009.


On Jan. 30, 2015, Cardinal George received the Knights of Columbus' highest honor, the *Gaudium et Spes* Award. Supreme Knight Carl Anderson said on that occasion: "In his brilliant speeches, homilies, letters and books, and in the brave witness to the faith that he has shown to the world — in sickness and in health — Cardinal George has proven over and over again one of the leading voices in the Catholic Church in the United States, and the Knights of Columbus is pleased to be able to honor him in this way for the great work he has done for so long."

May his soul and the souls of the faithfully departed rest in peace. Amen
